SKATER CODE OF CONDUCT

General Guidelines:

SCSFSC is committed to creating a safe and positive environment for members' physical, emotional, and social development and ensuring that it promotes an environment free of misconduct. This Skater Code of Conduct has been established to ensure the safety of all members using our ice, to ensure quality practice time for all home club, associate, non-members, and guests who purchase ice from the club, and who participate in all club-related activities.

1. All skaters, regardless of whether they hold home club, associate, non-member, or guest status, must follow and uphold the provisions in this Skater Code of Conduct regarding behavior on and off the ice. All club members are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship and be courteous toward their fellow skaters, coaches, parents/guardians of skaters, U.S. Figure Skating officials, and guests.
2. SCSFSC is committed to promoting a positive and friendly environment for all skaters. Remember 'The Golden Rule' – treat other people like you want to be treated – with respect.

Ice Etiquette and Safety:

1. While in lessons or practice, it is the skater's responsibility to always be conscientious and aware of other skaters around them.
2. Skaters must skate with the flow of other skaters and familiarize themselves with the most commonly used areas for jumps and spins.
3. The only time a skater has the SOLE right of way is when they are skating their program to music. When you hear another member's music, please extend that person the courtesy and move out of their path momentarily. This only takes a moment, and you will enjoy the same courtesy while you are performing your program.
4. Advanced skaters are expected to exhibit patience toward beginner members of the club. Remember, you were an inexperienced skater once, and it takes time for our future generation to advance to the point where they are completely comfortable skating with all levels of skaters.

Unsafe or Discourteous Behavior: Unsafe or discourteous behavior of any kind will not be tolerated.

Skate Safe: Skate safe policies will be followed and adhered to by all members of SCSFSC.

- Encourage my child to do their best, enjoy skating, learn from mistakes, and resolve conflicts respectfully.
- Treat all individuals with dignity and respect, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity, or ability.
- Refrain from criticizing, ridiculing, bullying, or yelling at skaters, coaches, officials, volunteers, or other parents.
- Communicate any physical, mental, or medical concerns that may affect the safety of my child or others.
- Respect coaches by avoiding "sideline coaching" and supporting their professional expertise and development.
- Respect the decisions and authority of officials during competitions and test sessions.
- Appreciate and support the contributions of volunteers and club officials and fulfill my responsibilities as a club member.
- Follow the rules, policies, and standards of U.S. Figure Skating, including SkateSafe® and SafeSport requirements, and report any violations appropriately.
- Support the right of every skater to participate in a positive, safe, and respectful skating environment.
- Members and/or parents/guardians are responsible for the payment of all fees related to participation in Club activities, including ice contracts, coaching fees, show fees, competitions, and other applicable charges. Any concerns regarding payment must be communicated promptly to the Board of Directors/Treasurer. Failure to fulfill financial obligations or communicate payment difficulties may affect participation in Club programs and activities.

Release and Waiver

To the fullest extent permitted by law, I release and discharge SCSFSC, United States Figure Skating, their officers, directors, employees, coaches, officials, volunteers, agents, contractors, participants, sponsors, and facility owners or operators ("Released Parties") from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, damages, or liabilities arising out of or relating to participation in the Activities, including claims arising from the negligence of the Released Parties.

Indemnification

I agree to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Released Parties from any claims, damages, liabilities, costs, or expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, arising from my participation or the participation of my minor child in the Activities.

Club Supervision

I understand that SCSFSC may provide rules, policies, and ice monitors, but is not responsible for the continuous supervision of participants during Club Ice sessions.

SCSFSC Understanding Volunteer Hours FAQ –Please keep for reference

- **Introductory Members are required to do 15 volunteer hours in their 1st year**
- **Senior members are required to do 30 hours of volunteer work yearly**
- **All members must complete the 30 required service hours from July 2026 to June 2027. If the requirement is not met, a \$250 fee will be charged to the online registration or billed separately. Consideration should be given to getting the hours completed throughout the season and not waiting until the end of the season to fulfill hours.**
- **Within the 30 service hours, members are required to support the Shores Autumn Classic/SAC competition for a minimum of 4 hours and 2 Reflections on Ice/ROI shows/shifts during the ice show weekend**
- **Monetary donations can be part of your volunteer time donation, but cannot replace the required hours at SAC and ROI.**
- **Each \$10 equals 1 service hour. Receipts are necessary to approve monetary donations as service hours, and receipts must be turned in.**
- **When a member reaches 50-plus service hours, they are given 1 adult free entrance to the banquet; skaters are free at the banquet.**
- **To be credited with the service hours, you must either sign in/out with your event chairperson, who will turn in your hours to the volunteer coordinator, or turn in your volunteer hours/monetary donation via a volunteer form to the volunteer coordinator.**
- **Volunteer hours will be emailed monthly.**
- **There are many other opportunities for volunteer hours—chairperson roles, extra help for events or activities within the club, etc. If you are worried about your volunteer hours, please contact Lindsay or any of the SCSFSC board.**
- **The volunteer form will be available outside the club office, can be sent to you by email, or will be available at the events.**
